The Old Calf Pasture along Lowell Road beside the Sudbury and Concord Rivers is today a buffer from development of the confluence and a reminder of just how close to the town center grazing and other agricultural activities were in earlier years. It is believed that the area has been open meadow or pasture land since before Concord existed. In the seventeenth century, when the town was first settled, it was the "calf pasture" of its minister, the Rev. Peter Bulkeley. In 1879, when the Middlesex Central Railroad extended its right-of-way west from Lowell Road to the State Prison, to build the Reformatory Branch rail line, it took a strip of the old pasture along the southern edge. At the turn of the 20th century, the area north of RIVER CONFLUENCE the railroad developed into more of a recreational area, for walking, picnicking, and boating. At that time, the Concord Canoe Club built a boathouse, now gone, in the southwest corner of the meadow next to the railroad.

Old Calf Pasture Confluence Loop From the boat launch off Lowell Road, a sidewalk along Lowell Road heads toward Concord Center, passing the Old Calf Pasture on the right. A right turn into Keyes Road and another right beyond 141 Keyes Road leads to the town vehicle parking lot. A yellow-blazed trail up the abandoned Reformatory Branch rail line embankment beside the parking lot turns left to the Sudbury River. From there, the main trail of the Rivers Confluence heads to the right along the Sudbury and Concord Rivers back to the boat launch. Old Calf Pasture trails are flooded and impassable at times of high water. Walking time 20 minutes.

From Will Holden, Land Manager, Natural Resources Division:

“Yellow and red trails on the site get moderate use but can flood in spring/fall or times of heavy rain. We expect seasonal flooding on our properties and do what we can to facilitate access within reason, time, and resources. People often do a loop using the trails here, Lowell Rd, and our Municipal campus, and also connect in from Reformatory Branch Trail.”

Singular mature trees, woodland buffer and marshland surrounds the perimeter of the site, which sits at the confluence of the Assabet and Sudbury rivers, where they join to make the Concord River.

VIEWSHEDS & HISTORICAL RESOURCES NOTES:

Historic information about the neighboring sites such as Egg Rock and Old Calf Pasture are located in brochures available online and have been located inside the Trailhead Signage, however the site was flooded so assessors were unable to access it. Very beautiful scenic spot, even in winter.

ENVIROMENTAL RESOURCES & CONCERNS NOTES:

Several online brochures for the site suggest invasive plants throughout the adjacent marshland, including loosestrife.

RECOMMENDED STRATEGIES & ACTIONS:

- Add accessible paved parking space and aisle connected by a short, paved walkway to a concrete platform at water's edge to make this site ADA accessible.
- Better trail marking.
- Road into site deeply rutted and a need of repair.

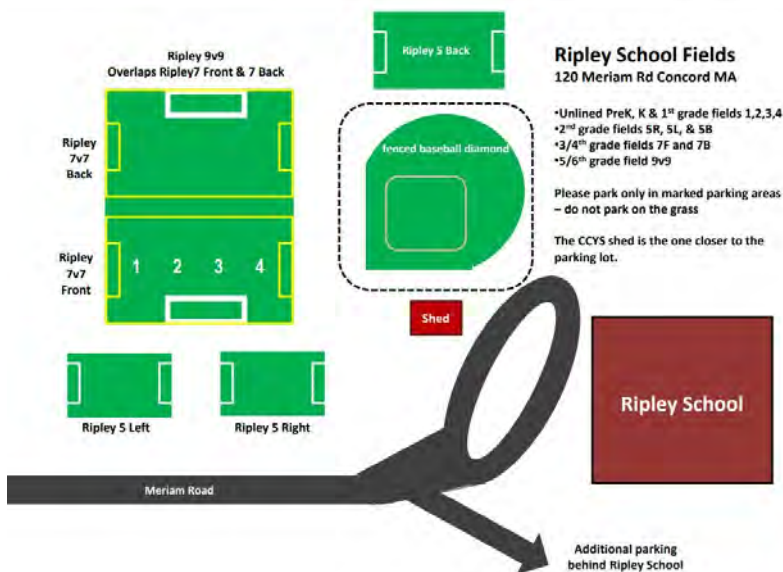

The third play space has a shaded picnic area, shaded sand box and trike roadway and is surfaced in painted concrete.

- Teachers have placed foam around megaphones that appear to be at exactly the head height of child users. Recommend annual inspection by a CPSI and regular maintenance inspections throughout the year.

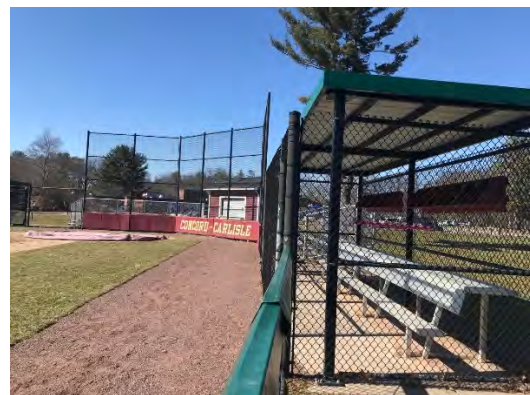

Bert Comins, Assistant Natural Resources Director, Town of Concord: "Moderate; Out of 263 survey responses, 21% use the pond for boating/canoeing/kayaking, 16% use the pond for ice skating, and 7% use the pond for fishing. The majority of respondents indicated they participate in these activities once or more per year but less than monthly. Water based usage of the pond is highest from late spring to early summer before invasive aquatic vegetation creates navigational challenges."

There is discussion about a plan to remove an existing dam at Warner's Pond. Bert Comins: "Under the dam removal alternative currently being considered opportunity for ice skating would certainly be reduced but it is unlikely to be eliminated entirely. It is expected that an approximately 4.5-acre area of open water would remain adjacent to the Gerow Recreation Area where ice skating would still be possible."

Incredibly quiet, peaceful, and scenic water access point with lots of waterfowl along a main road in residential neighborhood near Massachusetts Correctional Institution at Concord. Located near other recreation sites on Warner's Pond, including the Bruce Freeman Rail Trail and Gerow Park.

ENVIROMENTAL RESOURCES & CONCERNS NOTES:

Interesting educational information located on the Trailhead signage including information about "Aquatic Hitchhikers" (invasive plants or aquatic life brought from other water sources to this pond on watercraft) as well as Concord's "Least Wanted Invasive Plants."

RECOMMENDED STRATEGIES & ACTIONS:

- Add accessible paved parking space and aisle with connected by a short paved walkway to a concrete platform at water's edge to make this site ADA accessible.
 - Add regulatory signage about what types of watercrafts (boats) are allowed on Warner's Pond.
 - Install a small pier to enjoy the scenic water view or a small bird-hide for bird-watching during migratory seasons.

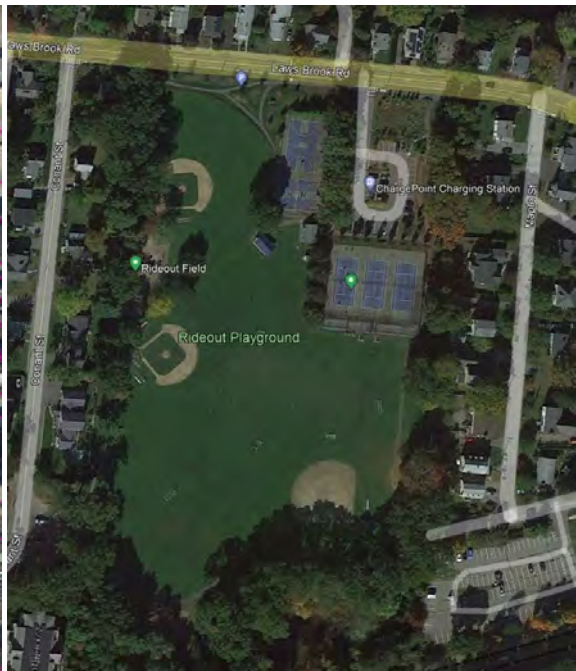

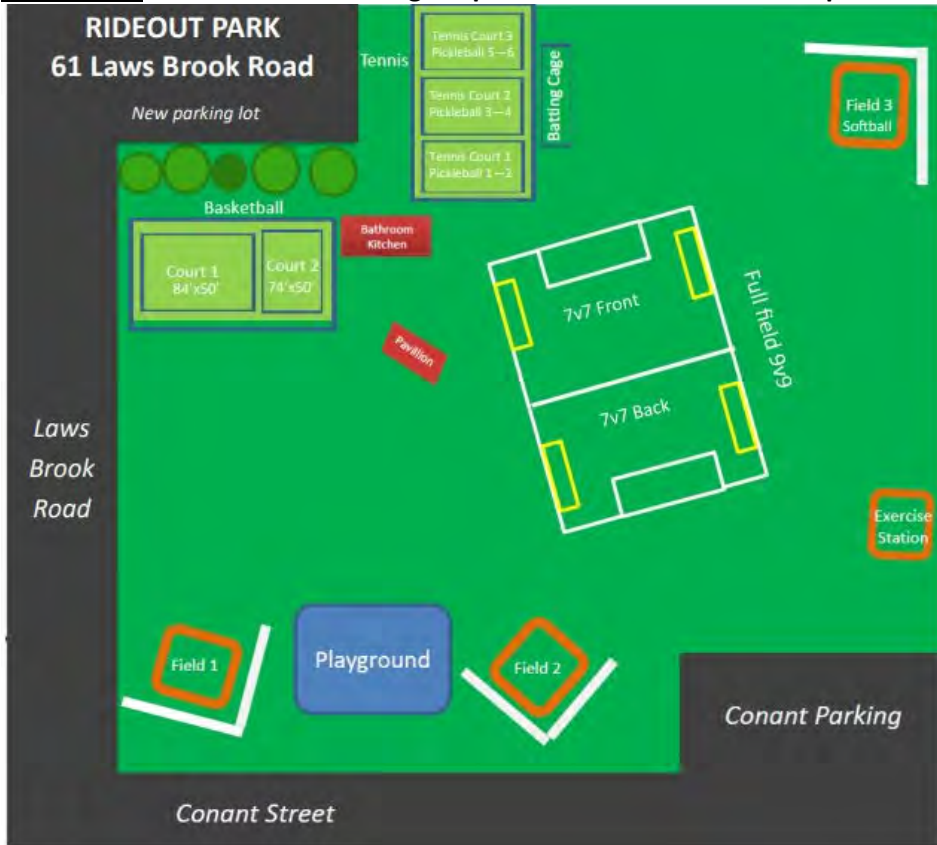

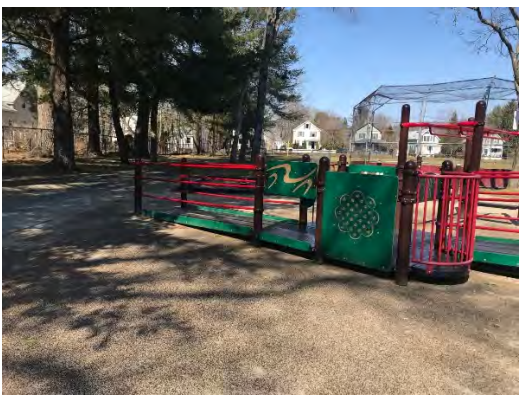

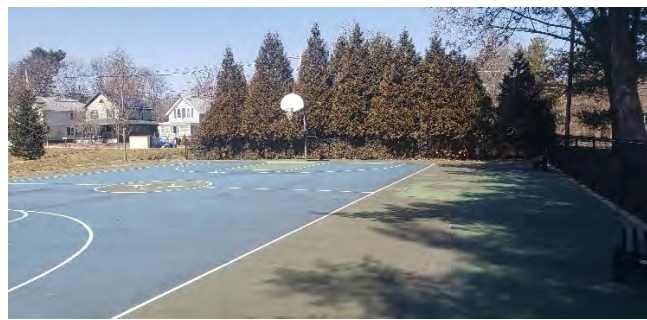

ATHLETIC FIELD NOTES:

The sports field had not been lined at time of site assessment. It is permitted on Concord Recreation's website for one (1) 9v9 field or two (2) 7v7 fields. A Google Earth pro satellite image from Oct 2021 showed a 80y x 55y lined field which is at the maximum range for youth 9v9 NFHS regulation field (70-80y x 45-55y). The field is located between baseball field #2 and softball field #3 in their outfields. This field cannot be used when baseball field #2 or softball field #3 are in use because of the overlap with the outfields, as per Concord Recreation's website. It was observed to have good grades and be generally flat with minor wet areas (perhaps due to the recent snow melt).

RECOMMENDED STRATEGIES & ACTIONS:

-None currently.

List other amenities and accessibility continued:

The basketball and tennis courts are accessible. The sports fields and batting cages are inaccessible. The perimeter walking loop is accessible except in one spot where tree roots may cause the path not to be ADA compliant. The playground has accessible play equipment, swings, raised sand box counter and a single accessible route to it. The Ninja Warrior-style exercise equipment is accessible.

- Consider developing a master plan for all park signage throughout Concord Recreation Facilities system.
- Add lighting to extend use or Wi-Fi to enable existing system to be operated remotely.

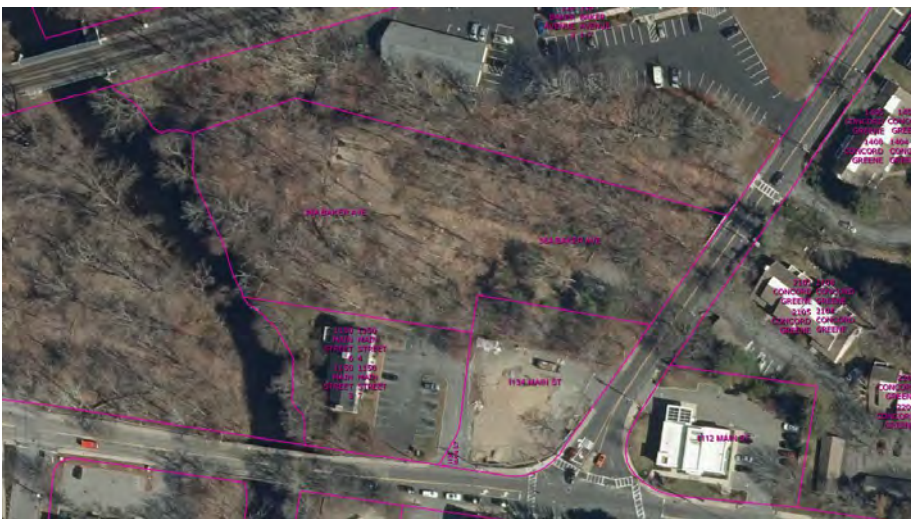

The water access point and picnic area is located off of Baker Avenue in a mixed use area of commercial, retail and residential buildings. A quick perpendicular turn down a gravel roadway into a gravel off-street designated parking lot leads to the entrance of this site. There is no park or canoe launch symbol sign to indicate the recreation resource. The site is surrounded by woods but during the winter season with the leaves off the trees, the user sees and hears the neighboring properties and uses reducing the sites' ability to provide a serene and green nature spot. Perhaps the site makes the user feel otherwise in spring, summer or autumn. The site has four distinct areas:

1. Dedicated Parking Lot and Raised Picnic Area on Composite Decking with Map Wayfinding Signage
The picnic area may be accessible.
2. Wood-chip trail lined extensively with a Pollinator Garden, including tagged native plants and educational information
3. Second informal Picnic Area located on existing remnant concrete pad
4. Potential boat launch area, flooded on day of site visit

A woodchip trail lined by stones leads users along a pollinator garden bounded by woods to a second picnic area and canoe launch that was flooded during the site visit. There are temporary interpretative signs along the path. There is no accessible route within the site.

Picnic area with two (2) Uline composite picnic tables, including one accessible table, on composite decking with ramp. Unfortunately, the pea gravel path leading to this area makes it inaccessible. Second picnic area with three (3) Uline composite picnic tables. Canoe launch area, flooded during visit.

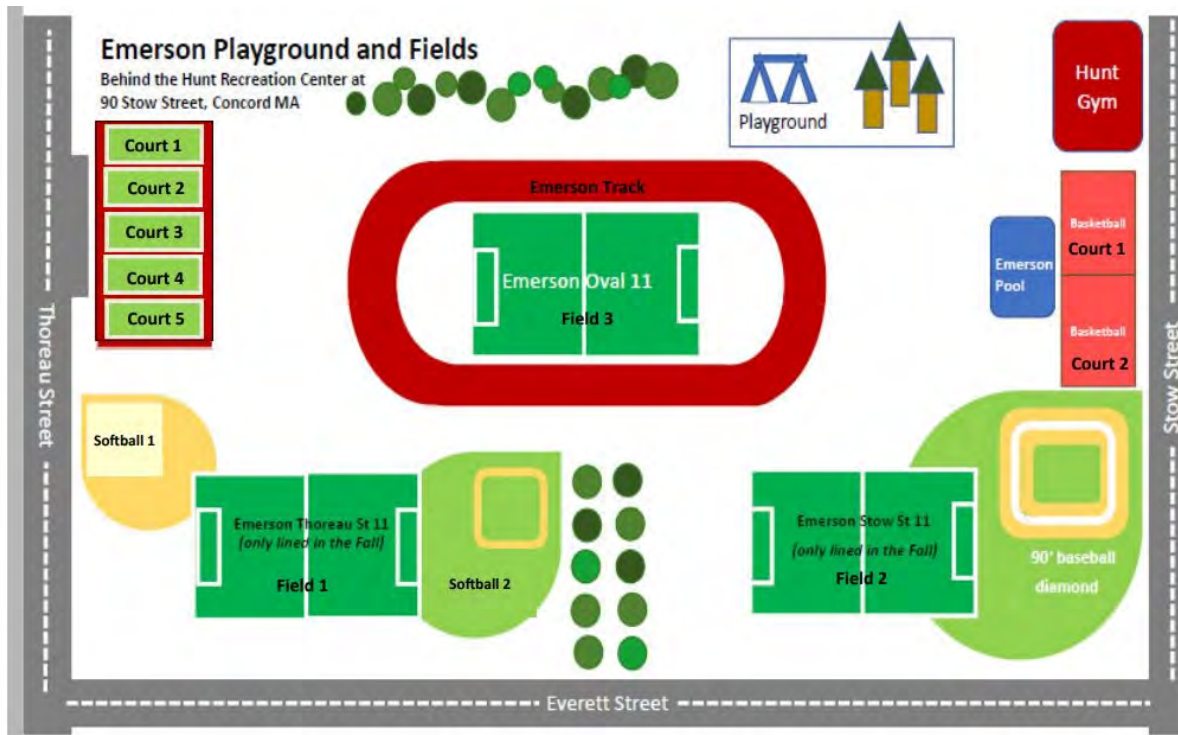

- Review grading between the center soccer field and track as it currently presents a fall hazard to users.
- Turf has undulations and heavy wear in spots (middle and near goals). Consider re-grading/re-seeding.
- Inadequate clear zone between outside/last lane and the C.L. fence (vertical structure). It is currently much shorter than the standard 1m and should be reviewed and corrected.

Most of the athletic fields and courts are accessible. Playground has some accessible play equipment and a single accessible route to it. Blister pads, curb cuts at two new accessible parking spaces. These elements should also be integrated into the parking lot by Hunt Recreation Center.

The allee of mature maples planted by the Garden Club of Concord during the 1930s, according to their September 2020 online newsletter, remains a major feature of the Everett Street entrance with flag poles and various memorials as well as the track (an original sports element of the park) terminating this walkway.

RECOMMENDED STRATEGIES & ACTIONS:

- Emerson Park feels disparate, carved up into smaller units of use and lacks an unifying element. Could trees along the pathway, much as they are shown in the 1926 plan, offering a needed 'unifying element' to the park? Could standardized site furnishings across this and all outdoor parks in the Concord Recreation Facilities system provide that unifying theme?
 - Consider improvements –adding paving, planting, sculptural element etc—to the entry plaza near Hunt Recreation Center to create a more welcoming and well-maintained atmosphere.
 - Create clarity on who is responsible for what at each facility in the Concord Park system.
 - Improve and standardize park signage at entrances to Emerson Park.
 - See all recommendation above at the end of each amenity.

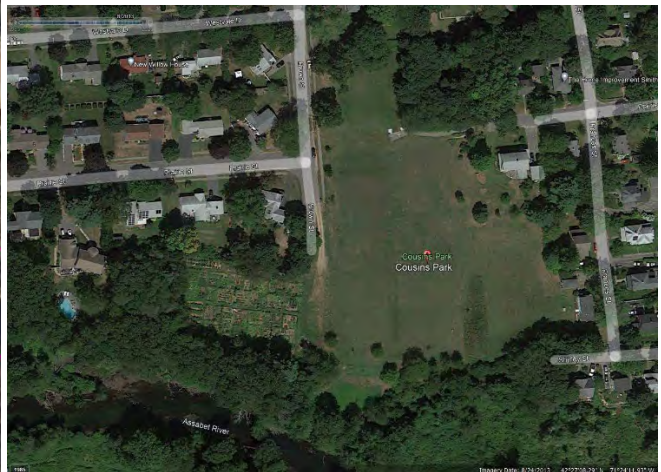

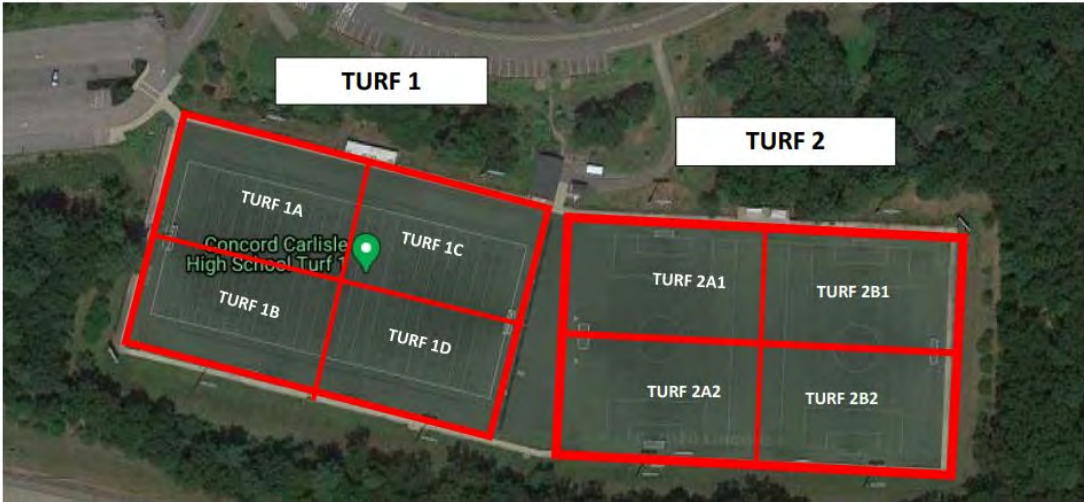

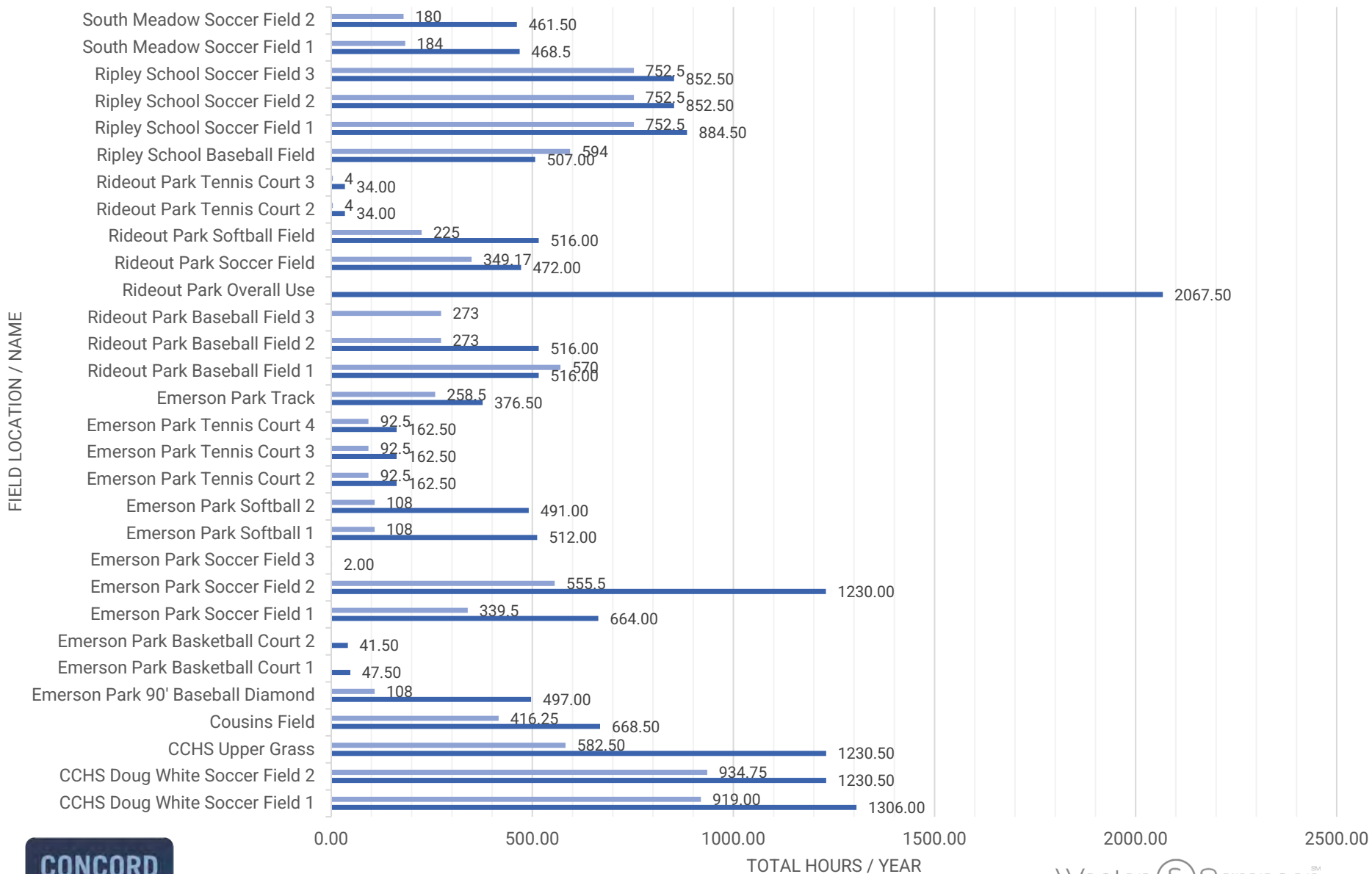
HOURLY PLAY BY SPORT, CONCORD-WIDE

TOWN-WIDE FIELD USE BY LOCATION - OUTDOOR

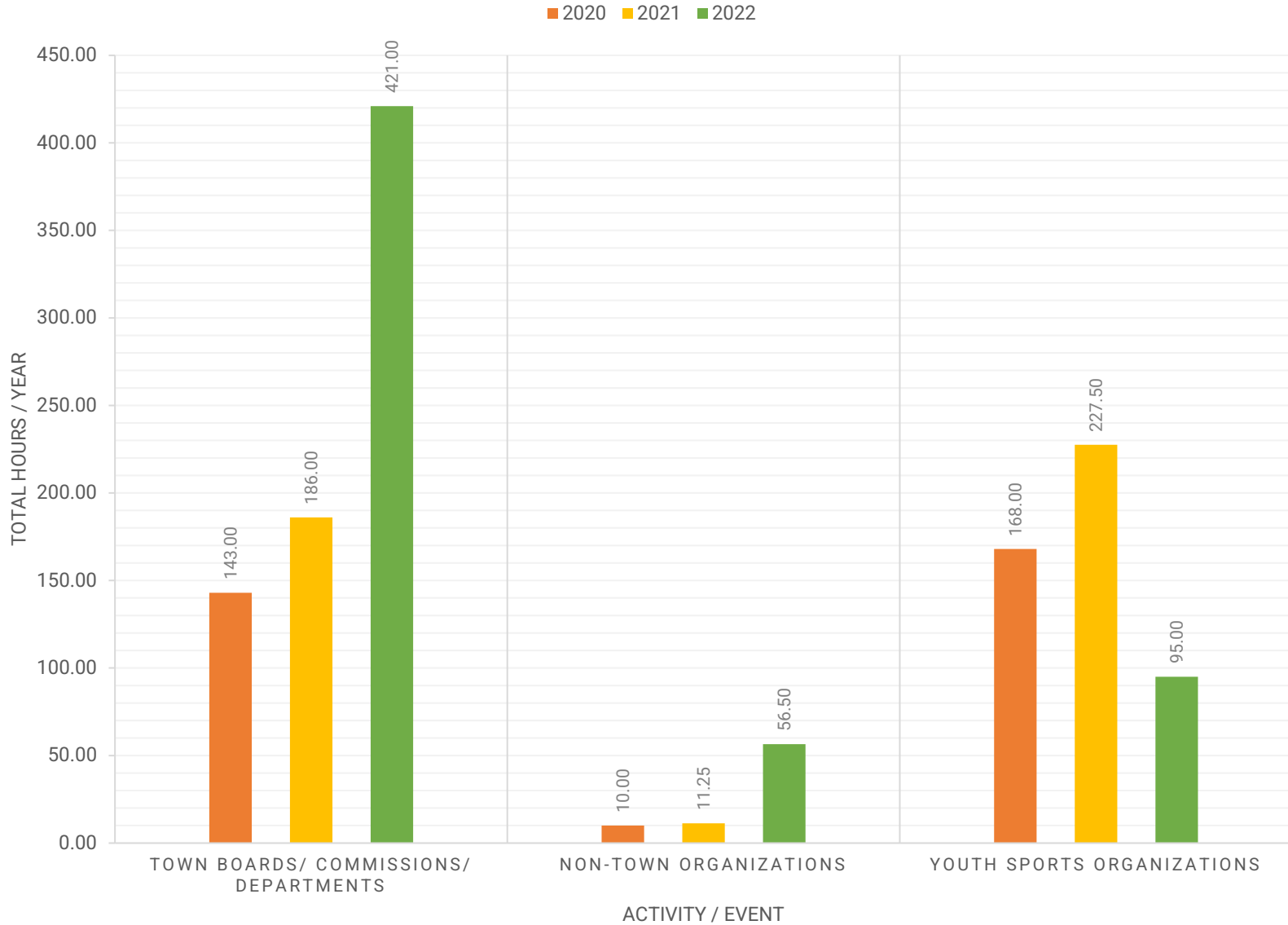

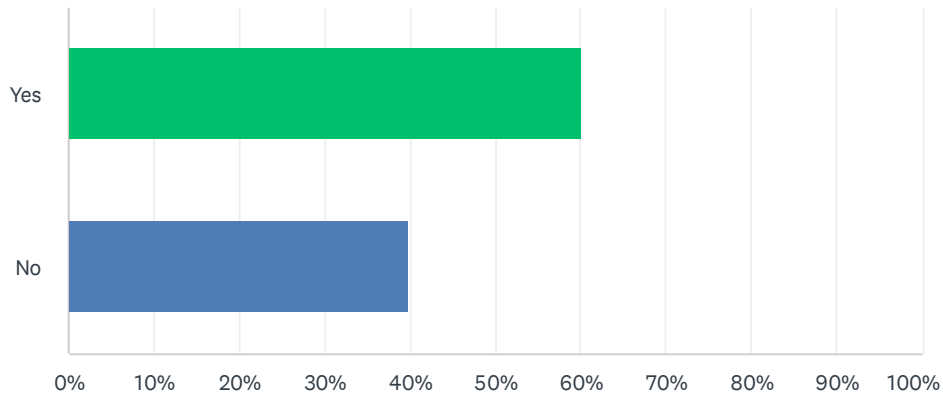

Q17 Which best describes you?

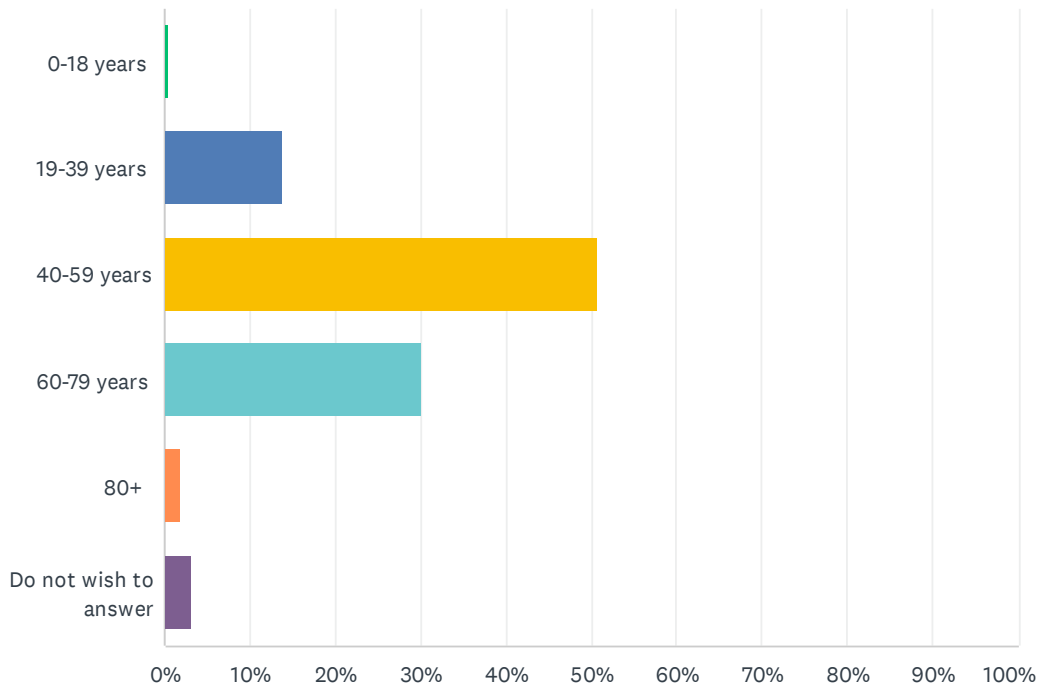

Q18 What is your age?

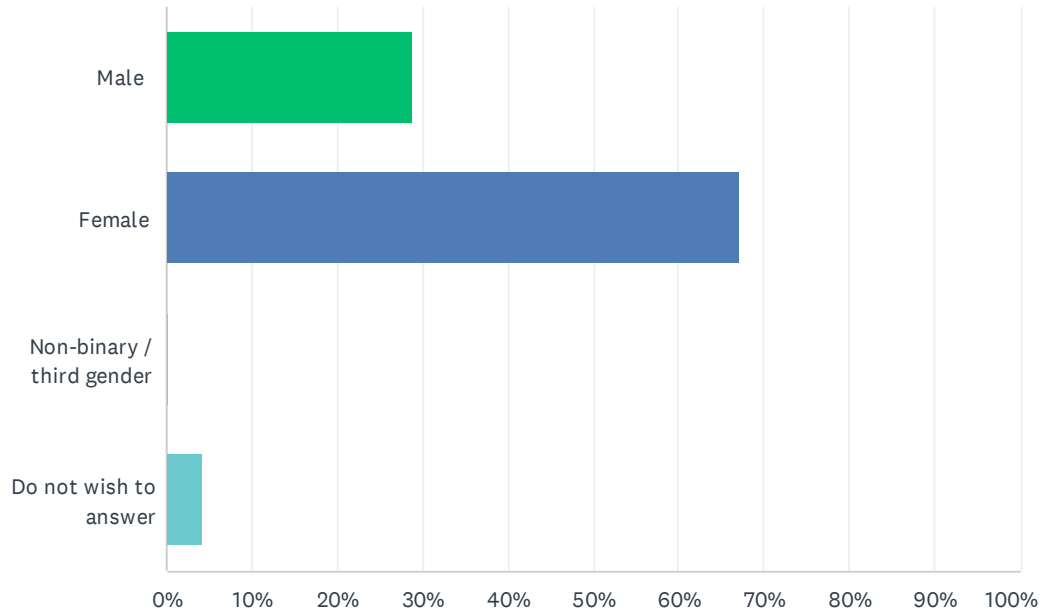

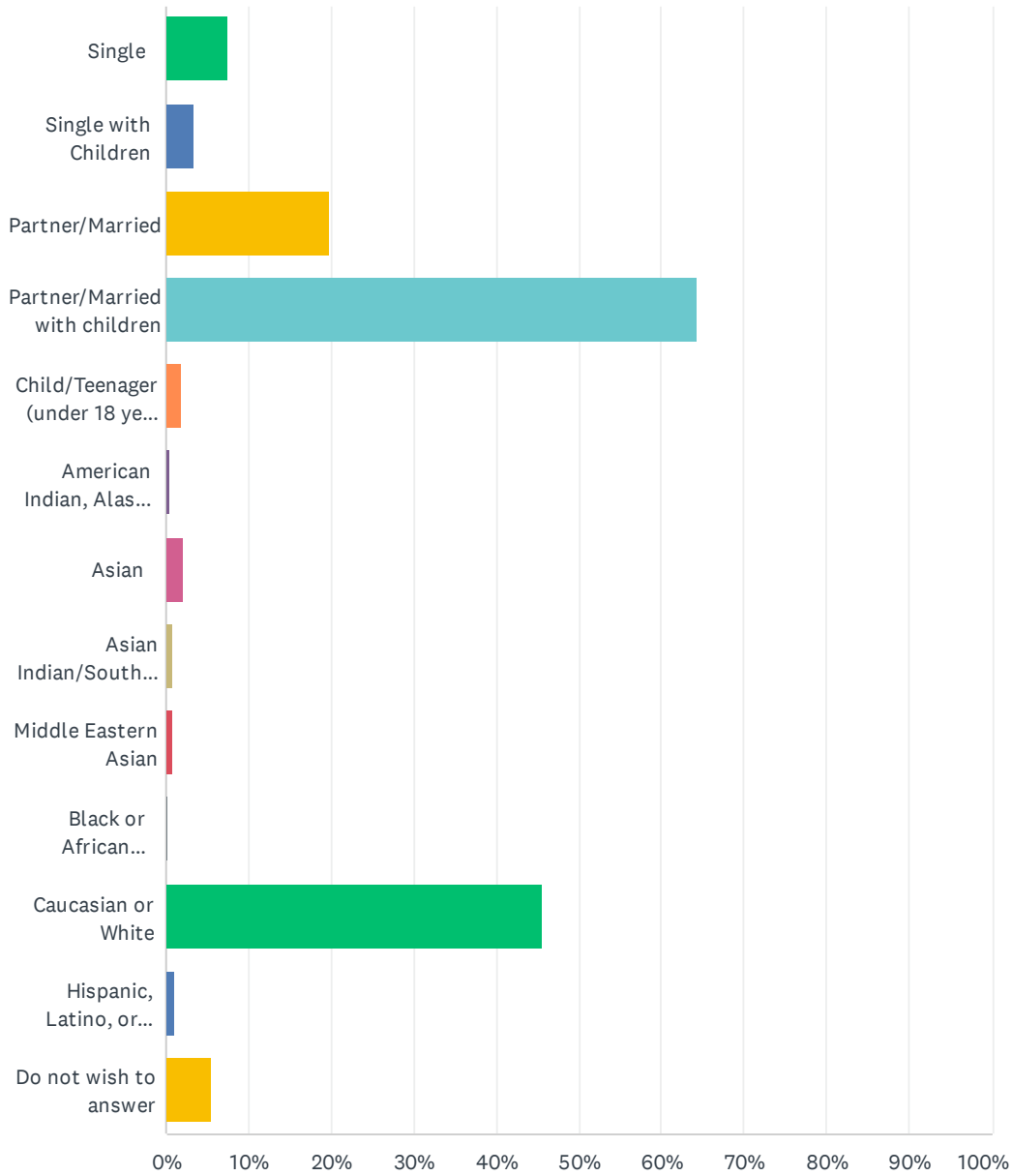

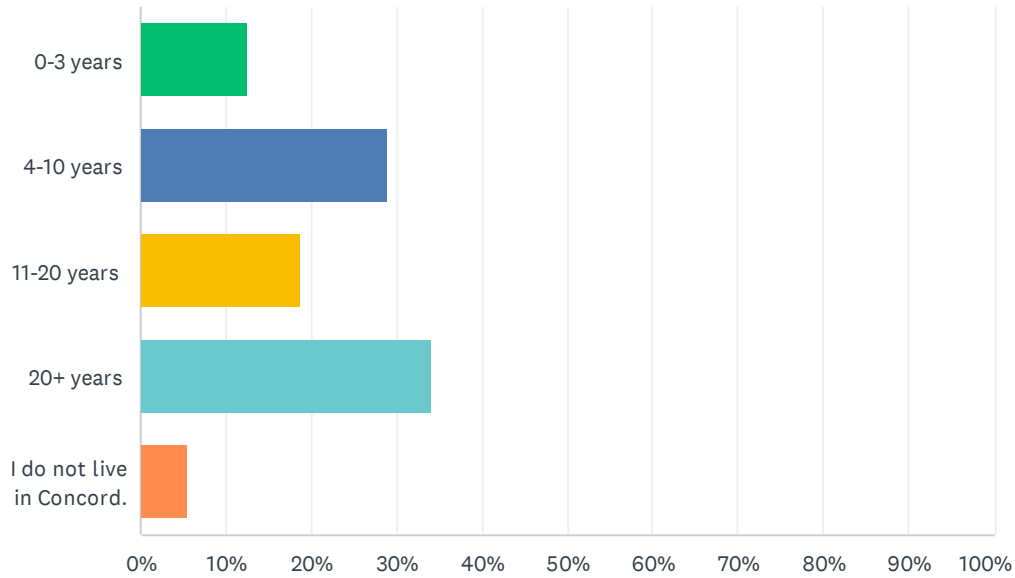

Q21 How long have you lived in Concord?

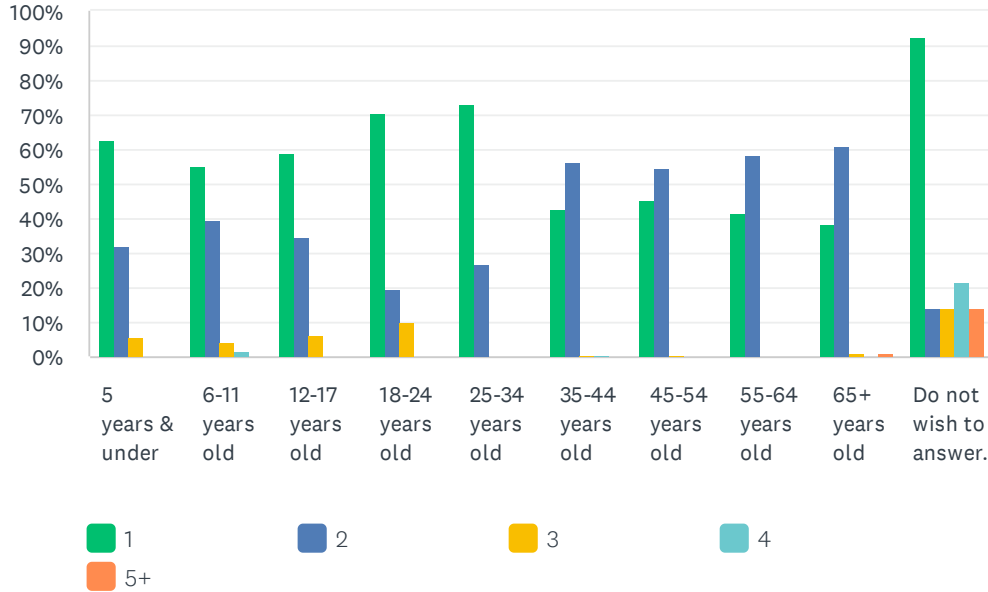

Concord Recreation Facilities Strategic Plan (RFSP)

This memo summarizes ideas and feedback generated by participants during the public meeting held on March 8, 2023, 5:00 pm to 7:30 pm in the Gymnasium, Hunt Recreation Center, 90 Stow St, Concord, MA 01742. Participants who joined the meeting in-person first visited topical tables with activities used to understand perceptions of current Town-owned recreation facilities and interest in future facilities and amenities. Participants then listened to a presentation given by Concord Recreation and Weston & Sampson staff members, which was also available to online participants. This presentation was followed by a Question and Answer session. Finally, in-person participants were able to re-visit the topical tables to add any additional reflections or comments.

Topical Tables and Activities:

In-person participants were able to visit six (6) tables set up in the gymnasium space and facilitated by Subcommittee members from 5:00 to 6:00pm. These tables were host to different topics on the Recreation Facilities Strategic Plan (RFSP). Activities at each table provided fodder to direct input and collect ideas and feedback from participants.

Two tables were located at the entrance. The first table contained a registration sign-in sheet with a site inventory map locating key Town-owned recreation facilities and interactive name tags. Participants could choose a name tag with a recreation topic that they supported. The second table contained hard copies of the online survey in three languages for completion and snacks for participants and was also located in the entrance to the gymnasium.

The following feedback was received at the topic tables and sign-in table:

Registration Table:

- **Sign-in Sheet:** Fourteen (14) people signed the registration sheet. the project team followed up the day after the Open House #1 with a thank you email for participating and links to the survey to share with neighbors, friends and others who care about Concord's recreation system.
- **Interactive Name Tags:** Participants most often chose "Walking & Bike Trails" and the blank nametags, where they could fill in their own area of recreational interest. One participant said she came to advocate for an outdoor performing space. Another participant said he came because he wanted more pickleball courts.
- **Site Inventory Map:** A large map locating Town-owned recreation facilities was located at the registration table. This map was frequently referenced by participants and Subcommittee members to locate facilities or to share where improved connections between recreation facilities could be made.

Survey Table:

- **Survey:** One participant completed a hard copy survey and most said they had completed it online. The hard copy survey has since been uploaded to the online survey.

The other four (4) tables included the following topics:

- **Topic 1:** Current Facilities and Amenities
- **Topic 2:** Future Recreational Needs & Programming

TOPIC 1: Current Facilities and Amenities

Participants were asked to provide ideas for improvement to the town's current facilities, feedback on where facilities are overused, where they would like to use parks, indoor recreation, and water access sites more frequently, and the kinds of accessible features that are most helpful. The goal of this exercise was to understand the condition or perceived condition of facilities in town and to learn where people frequent most and why, and conversely where they do not go and why. Participants engaged in the following activities and provided these ideas and feedback:

ACTIVITIES

Board: *What is your favorite park or indoor recreation facility in Concord and why?*

Participants were asked to write a comment under this question on a board.

General Comments

- *9-acre Corner / White Pond – need recreation facility i.e. – pool, workout center, indoor facilities; perhaps where Peabody is*
- *Bike Paths from 9-acre Corner / White Pond neighborhood to Concord Center Facilities*

TOPIC 2: Future Recreational Needs and Programming

Participants were asked what there is more (or less) demand for in terms of amenities / programs, to provide ideas on what amenities or programming would be desired if not currently offered, what improvement to the town's current facilities might be needed, and react to qualitative statements to better understand participants' perceptions of Concord's recreation system and how it could be better in the future. Participants provided the following ideas and feedback:

ACTIVITIES

Activity on Table: Visual Preference Voting Jars

Participants were asked to vote on preferences for future recreational needs by reviewing 12 topic areas. Topic areas and their examples included the following:

- Fields (Baseball, Lacrosse, Football, Soccer, Softball, Ultimate Frisbee)
- Courts (Basketball, Pickleball, Street Hockey, Tennis, Volleyball)
- Passive Recreation (Picnicking, Relaxing, Wildlife Observation)
- Water Recreation (Boating, Kayaking, Fishing, Splash Pad, Outdoor Swimming Pool)
- Trails & Cycle Paths (Hiking, Jogging, Mountain Biking, Bike Racks, Safer Routes)
- Indoor Recreation (Community Center, Swimming, Pool, Climbing, Hockey)
- Amenities (Pavilions, Restrooms, Picnic Tables, Seating, Signage/Wayfinding, Water Fountains)
- Planting (Trees, Landscaping, Upkeep & Maintenance)
- Universal Access (Curb cuts, Accessible Parking & Restrooms, Multi-lingual Maps, Inclusive Play)
- Playgrounds (Tot Lots, Adventure Playgrounds, Ninja Warrior-Style Equipment)
- Single-Use Park Amenities (Disc Golf, Golf/Driving Range, Skateboarding, Bocce Ball, Parkour)
- Wildcard for write in responses.

The goal of this exercise was to determine how much or how little of each use is needed in the future based on greatest needs, to understand what amenities or programming in Concord would be desired if not currently offered and to learn where there is more (or less) demand for amenities. This exercise received 197 responses shown in the graph below:

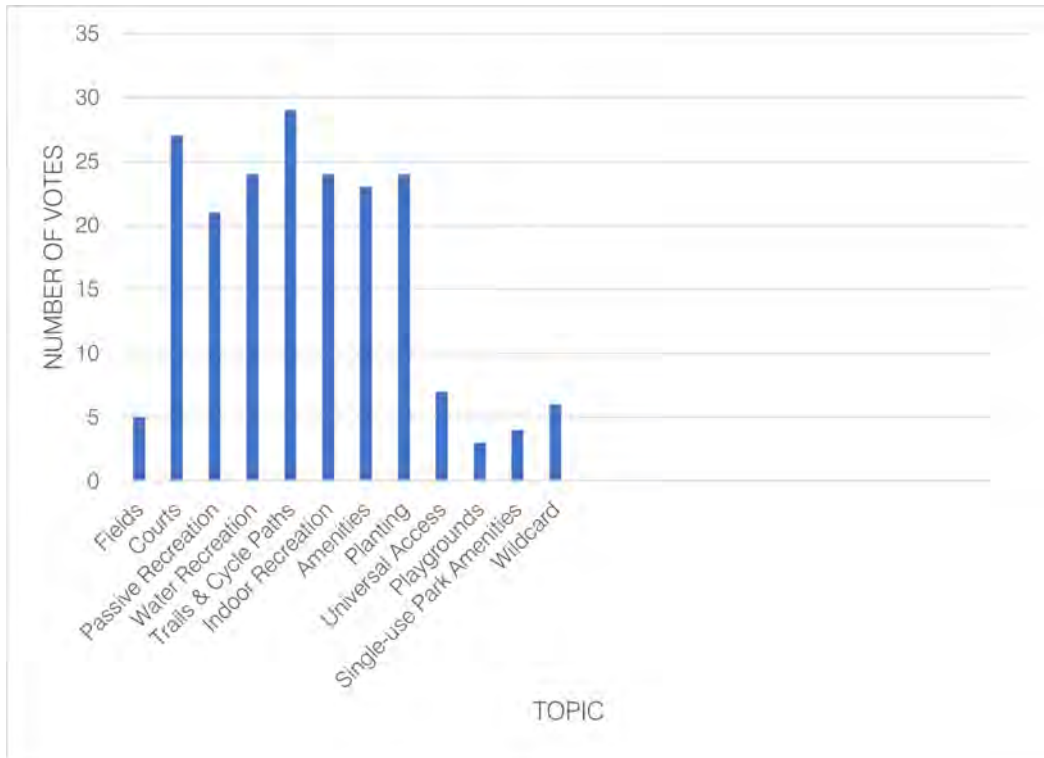


CHART: Future Recreational Needs and Programming – Visual Preference Voting Jars

Participants indicated a need for trails and cycle path as a top preference (29) followed by Courts (27). The following comment was left inside the jar for Courts:

- *All my votes are for pickleball; more indoor pickleball courts; the pickleball courts in Rideout need repair.*

Many participants also indicated a need for the following recreational facilities and amenities:

- Water recreation (24)
- Indoor Recreation (24)
- Planting (24)
- Amenities (23)
- Passive Recreation (21)

Less than 20 participants indicated a need for the following recreational facilities and amenities:

- Universal Access (7)
- Wildcard (6), with the following comments left inside the jar:
 - *Outdoor performance space (pavilion, amphitheater) (23 of 43 acres usable in West Concord at the NMI Starmet property)*
 - *Convert Peabody into indoor / outdoor recreation*
- Fields (5)
- Playgrounds (3)
- Single-use Park amenities (4)

Board: Tell us something you wish you had in Concord's recreation system.

Participants were asked to write a comment under this question on a board.

General Comments

- More restrooms
- More water fountains
- Outdoor performance space (x2)
- Coordinate with 250th anniversary committees, Concord Youth Theater, Catholic Church
- Concord Conservatory of Music looking for a new venue
- Preserve mountain and trail bike access
- Expand bike lanes
- Safe trail from 9-acre Corner to Concord Center
- Trails should not be paved. The Reformatory path paving was defeated in favor of natural path.
- I agree with [above statement] for primary walking paths (and I do walk) but for road cycling, paved paths are much better. So some of each?

- **Next Steps / How You Can Help!:** Question prompts for the public input Q&A session with Town contact information, a link to the project site, and online survey information

Two question prompts were provided for the question and answer session, which were:

- **Recreational Needs & Programming:** What kinds of amenities would you like to see?
- **Current Facilities & Amenities:** Do Town facilities meet your Personal Fitness Goals?

The following comments or questions were received during the question and answer portion of the evening:

- A comment about Pickleball becoming the fastest growing sport in America and the desire for more either dedicated pickleball courts or shared pickleball – tennis courts.
- A question about how the recreation facilities or programming recommendations borne from the RFSP relate to the Capital Plan.
- A question about context for the RFSP and how many other communities are creating RFSP.

- A question and comment about how the RFSP is eaging the “grey population” including groups like the Council on Aging and the Commission on Disability. The need to make outdoor recreation accessible for this “grey” demographic.
- A question about whether State and Federal properties are being included in this study.
- A question about the last RFSP in 2014 and whether those outcomes were advertised somewhere, accessible on the internet.
- A question about how long the RFSP is good for (7-10 years, from Anna McKeown).
- A question about thebproposed dates for implementation (Capital Planning projects are 5-7 years, some short-term and some long-term projects and some much longer term project, Anna McKeown).
- A question about the acquisition of new properties, specifically about the Beede Swim & Fitness Center given as donated land (but that whatever was built on it would need to be in the interest of the whole town, Anna McKeown).

Several Subcommittee members or members of the Weston & Sampson design team provided reflections on the Open House #1 the day after the event. These comments that were heard and summaries per team member include:

Cassie Bethoney:

- Concord needs more indoor soccer fields and basketball courts. People have to travel outside Concord for soccer and Hunt is the only resource in Concord for basketball.
- Pickleball was a priority for one person, particularly adding more indoor court space.
- Add an outdoor performance space that can be used by local theater and student groups, who never have enough space (I noted these groups on my post-its). There are examples in other communities that can be indoor/outdoor to make use of it year-round. Coordinate these efforts with the Town anniversary event coming up.

Paul Boehm:

There were some interesting comments on space for performance venues, specifically outdoor venues -music, theater. Need land for that and other multi uses. Also needs for more indoor basketball space. The comment was that there is too much competition at Hunt for basketball space and we need another space or facility. Some comments about Peabody school being used for that purpose in the future. A specific need for more fitness facilities, in particular large workout rooms for aerobics. Got the impression that there’s a big demand for fitness space. And, of course, can’t get enough pickle ball space. The pickle ball people showed up. However, I don’t put that issue any higher priority than some of the other issues were hearing though.

Gail Dowd:

The couple of items that are fresh in my mind – other than the amazing tip on how to actually separate the name tags from the paper:

- Several folks mentioned pickle ball
- The most interesting item was the woman who was interested in an outdoor performing arts location/venue

Anna McKeown:

- A few people talked about more access from point A to point B on bikes, ie bike lanes. (white pond beach to Concord center and west concord center)
- One man was passionate about not adding more amenities to Emerson Park. He was also hopeful that we can reduce the number of dogs in the park.
- I had a family VERY interested in some sort of kayak/boat option at white pond.
- Various people did not know where Cousins and South Meadow were (leads to better signage/advertising).
- I had an interesting convo with a biker who said that there is an old dirt horse track in the woods behind Walden pond that people use for hiking and mountain biking? Not sure if that is legit or not but made me start to think about what trails there may be for mountain biking. He also said better signage at trail heads on how to share the trail with bikes/hikers.

Phil Griffiths:

- I heard many of the same things you all did, the one additional conversation I had was an indoor studio space for group classes.
- Lots of pickle ball - no surprise there - but I really liked the idea of looking at improved connectivity between parts of the town and to existing recreation opportunities.

Weston & Sampson conducted a second public engagement event for the Town of Concord Recreation Facilities Strategic Plan (RFSP) from 12-2pm on Saturday June 3, 2023: a “pop-up” table at the Stow Street Block Party, a free community event sponsored by Concord Recreation and held inside the Hunt Recreation Gymnasium, Concord, Massachusetts. Brandon Kunkel, Landscape Architecture Practice Leader, and Lindsey Abbott, Project Landscape Architect, managed the table. Weston & Sampson’s Project Manager Cassie Bethoney was unable to attend the event. During the event, Weston & Sampson representatives spoke with approximately 80 adults, youth and children who engaged with the table.

Banner signage was placed at the Hunt Recreation Center entry and on the table display. Weston & Sampson walked around the community event and encouraged members of the public to cast their votes at the table. Many members of the public were willing to participate in the activity and showed interest in the project by asking further questions. Several participants knew about the Concord RFSP already and had taken the online survey. Participants included the following:

- A range of ages, young children, teens, young adults, middle aged, elderly, and retired folks
- Single individuals and families
- Diverse racial and ethnic backgrounds.
- Residents of Concord and visitors both from nearby towns and from out-of-state.

Table Displays and Activities:

The table display included one (1) table-top activity and four (4) easels with the following information:

- A map indicating Concord’s recreational facility inventory, highlighting the (12) recreation facilities that were evaluated as part of the RFSP and the six (6) proposed sites to be included in the concept design portion of the plan.

- What had been learned and observed through the RFSP to date, including a summary of the online survey results, sites that were evaluated and critical needs
- Overall project goals
- A project schedule that shows work completed to date as well as the next steps in the process, which involves the development of concept plans for the four (4) recreation sites that attracted the most votes.
- Critical needs identified to date
- Voting preferences table activity, as shown in the image below

General Observations / Comments:

- Many participants questioned whether the proposed sites were Town-owned properties already and wanted to know more about the proposed sites to be sure they understood what they were voting for. One participant asked several questions about how current recreation sites were paid for and how these proposed sites would be (“through our local taxes?”).
- Participants often voted for proposed recreation sites that were near their homes, referencing the map. Participants discussed living near the Gerow site (and Bruce Freeman Bike Trail, Concord Prison) and wishing to see that developed further.
- Several participants knew about the Superfund Starmet site and liked the idea of re-using it as a sport complex. One participant said she liked how “convenient” a sports complex as described on the board for the Starmet Corporation site would be with everything at one location.
- The water-based sites – Baker Avenue, Gerow, Warner’s Pond [written in as a wildcard] -- seemed to strike participants’ interest and discussion.
- One participant discussed how he and his family had visited most of Concord’s outdoor recreation facilities during the pandemic and how valuable they had been. A section about the increasing importance of recreational resources and amenities in a post-pandemic world should be included in the report.
- A pickleball enthusiast discussed various creative ways she and other pickleball coaches and players offer lessons and hold games at various outdoor courts and indoor school gymnasium courts in Concord and other neighboring towns.
- Concord-Carlisle Community Chest (<https://www.cccommunitychest.org/>) shared that food security was uncovered as an issue through their recent needs assessment, with 1 in 3 children arriving at school hungry in Concord and Carlisle. The RFSP may consider ways in which to offer support in this area.

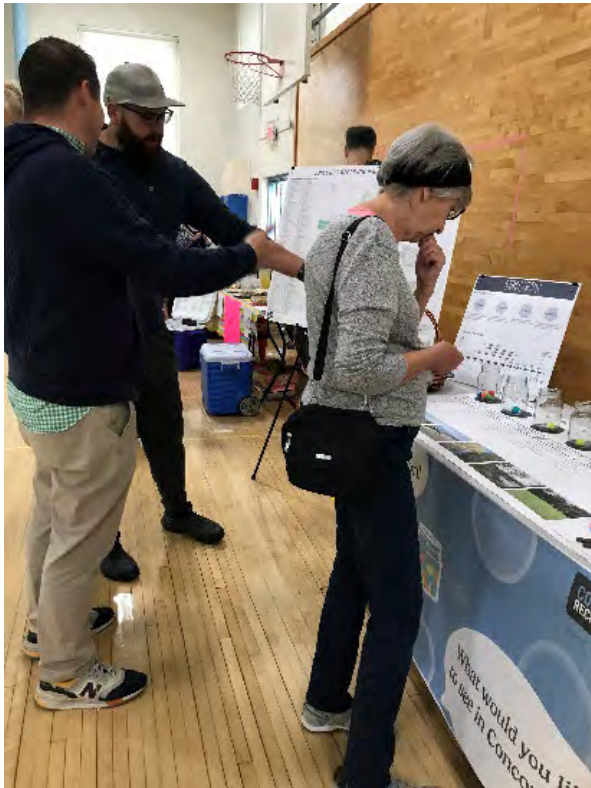

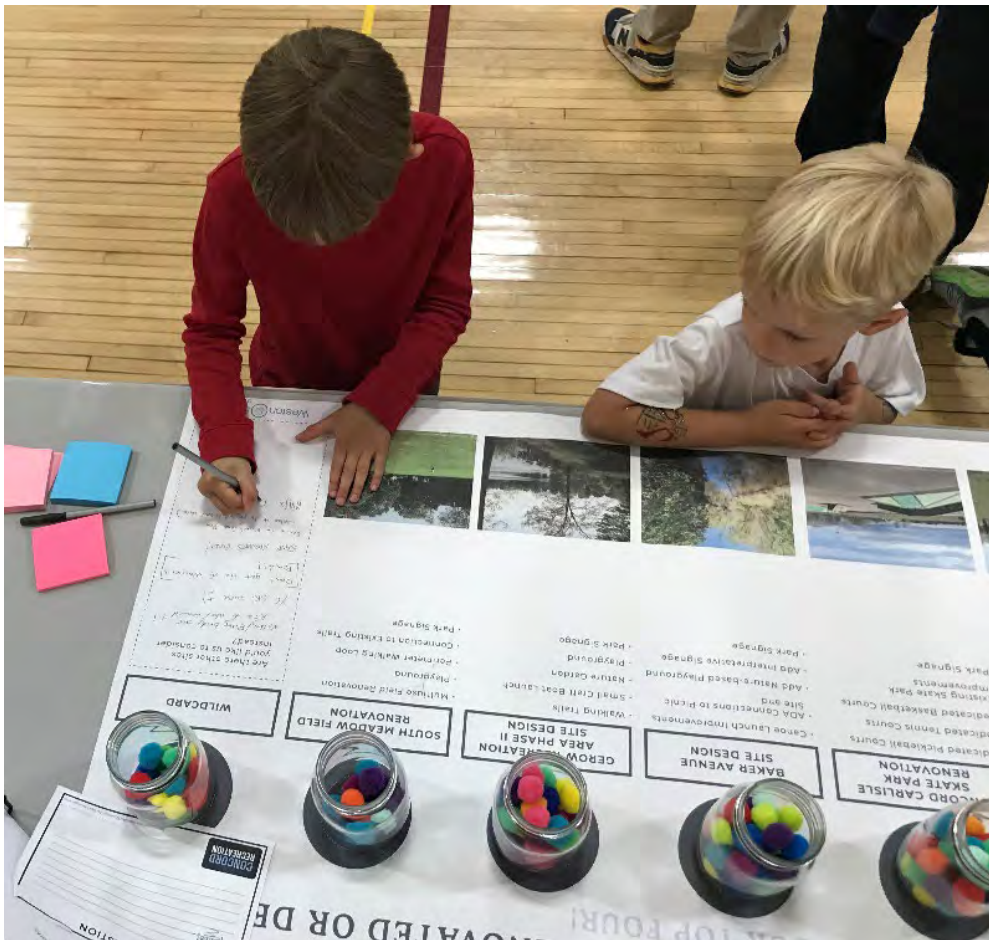

SUBJECT: Public Engagement Event #3 – “Pop-up” Table at Summer Concert Series, Rideout Park, Concord Recreation Facilities Strategic Plan

Weston & Sampson (W&S) conducted a third public engagement event for the Concord Recreation Facilities Strategic Plan (RFSP) from 5:30-9:00pm on Thursday July 20, 2023: a “pop-up” table at the Summer Concert Series Beantown Swing Orchestra, a free community event sponsored by Concord Recreation and held at Rideout Park in West Concord, Massachusetts. W&S’s Project Manager Cassie Bethoney and Lindsey Abbott, Project Landscape Architect, managed the table. During the event, approximately 58 adults, youth and children engaged with the table; 40 participants participated in the tabletop voting activity.

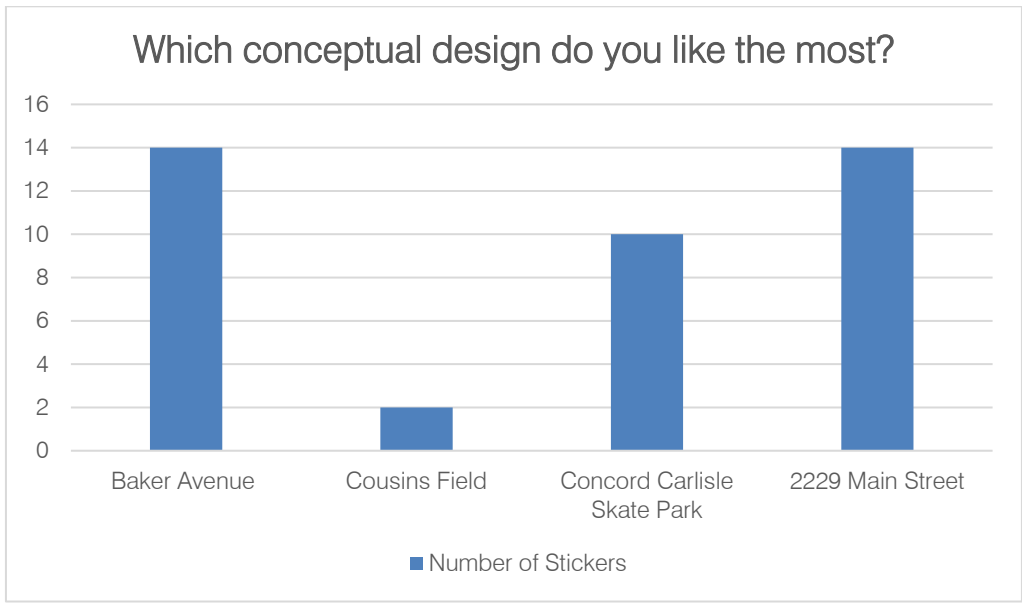
A tent with display tables and banner signage was located at the main entrance to Rideout Park, close to the restrooms, ice cream truck and picnic pavilion where the band was set up. Weston & Sampson made an announcement during the concert to encourage members of the public to visit the pop-up table and vote for their priority .

At the table, W&S staff encouraged members of the public to cast a single sticker vote for the conceptual design that they liked most and thought the Town of Concord should prioritize first out of the four conceptual designs. When voting, W&S staff shared that the four priority sites had been chosen by the public at the second community engagement event to receive conceptual designs and featured recreational amenities that were suggested at previous events, the site evaluations, the online survey, needs assessment and other earlier aspects of the study. The concepts shared at this event were merely high level conceptual ideas, or fit studies, to understand what may be possible at each site. Many members of the public lingered, asked questions, and shared their thoughts and insight while examining the conceptual boards. Several participants knew about the Concord RFSP already, had come to a previous community engagement event, and/or had taken the online survey. Participants included the following:

- A range of ages, including a few young children accompanied by their parents, teens, young adults, middle aged, elderly, and retired folks
- Single individuals and families
- Primarily residents of Concord and with a few visitors both from nearby towns and one individual from out-of-state.

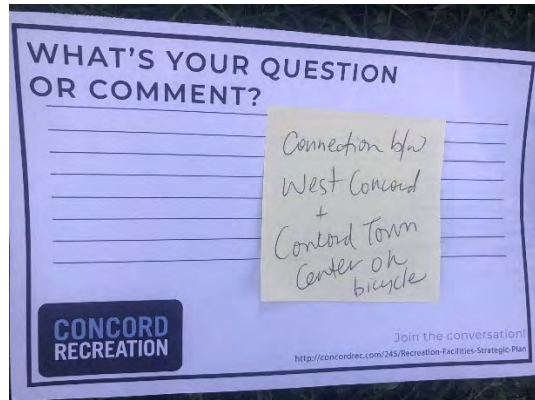
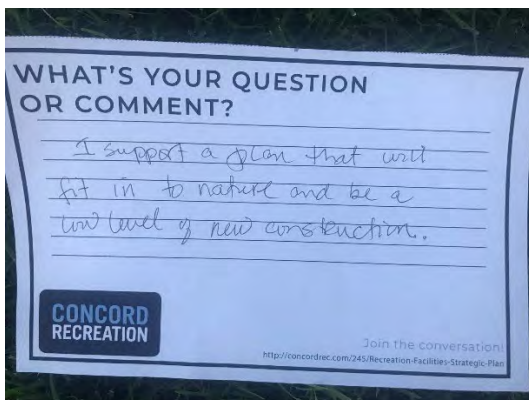

General Observations / Comments:

- Concord Recreation Director Anna McKeown and Concord RFSP Subcommittee member Paul Boehme stopped by the pop-up table.
- Not everyone who came to learn about the study voted (18 people did not vote).
- Participants used the map to orient themselves from Rideout Park, where the community event took place, or from West Concord town center or Concord town center, to understand where the four (4) conceptual plan sites were located.
- Some participants read the other background information boards. The survey results seemed to interest some participants, in particular.
- As for the conceptual design boards, participants were either interested in the large scale and diverse amenities offered in the 2229 Main Street conceptual design or the simplicity, light intervention, lower cost, and short-time frame buildability of the Baker Avenue conceptual design. Both proposals received equal votes (14).
- Many participants were active members of various Town committees or environment-based groups such as the Sudbury, Assabet, and Concord Wild and Scenic River Stewardship Council. Both the 2023 River Ambassador and Assistant River Ambassador came to the table to share their comments.
- Many other Concord projects were referenced, suggesting a group of participants who were knowledgeable and engaged with Town developments, including the following specifically referenced projects: Warner's Pond dam study and the Gerow recreation site and the Bruce Freeman Rail Trail, Concord Prison).
- Several high-school and college-aged participants liked the addition of recreation amenities at the Concord-Carlisle Skate Park site near the high school, especially the disc golf course. Several mothers of teenagers remarked on the need for more gathering spaces and programming focused on healthy activities for teenaged children in the evenings and weekends. These participants all voted for the Concord-Carlisle Skate Park option.
- Quite a few participants remarked on the need for better connections, particularly via bicycle between West Concord and Concord (town center).

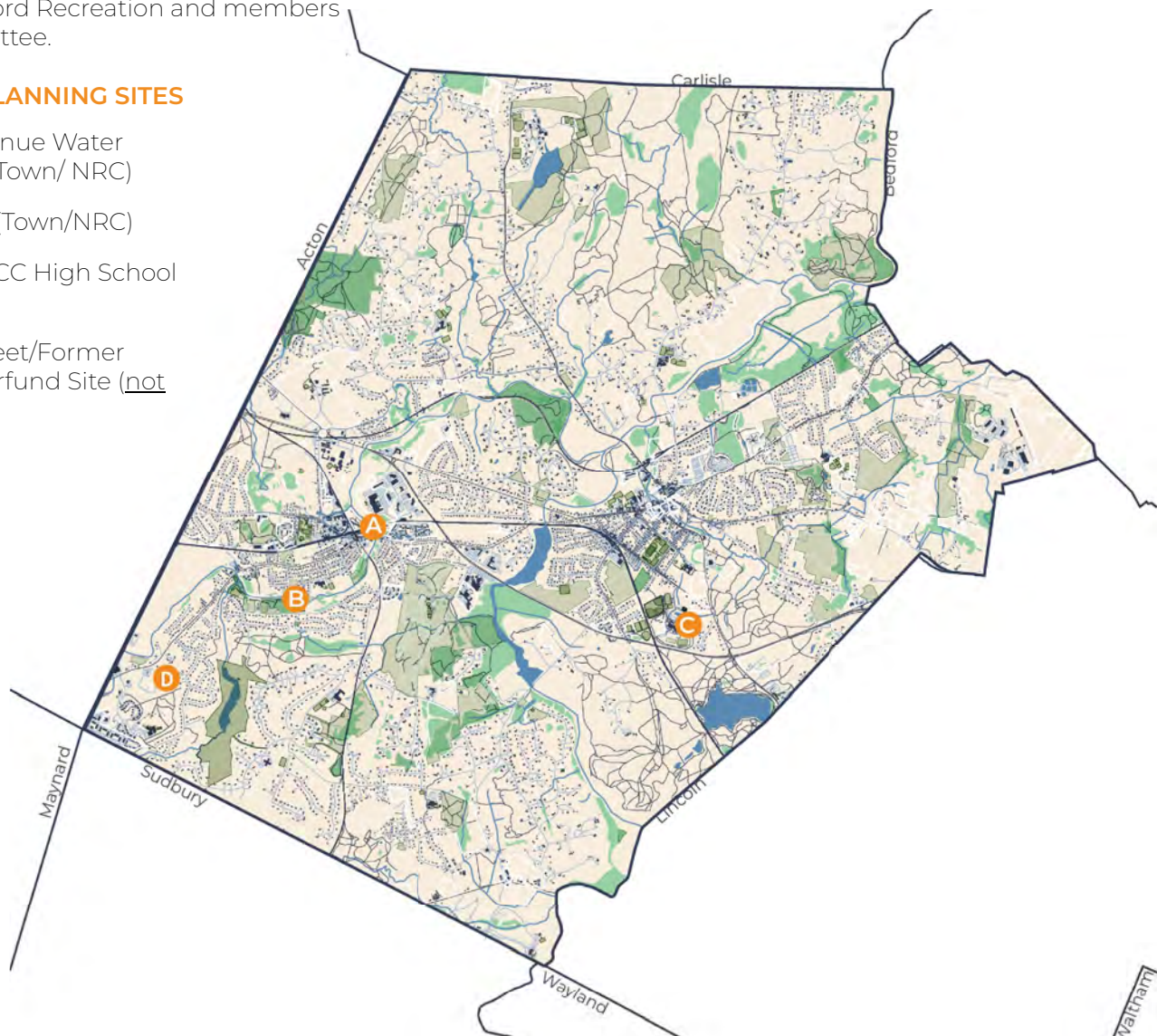

- B** Cousins Field (Town/NRC)
- C** Skate Park at CC High School (CCHS)
- D** 2229 Main Street/Former Sarmet Superfund Site (not Town-owned)

Beyond addressing critical needs, recreation improvements suggested were in consideration of each site's size, contextual location within Concord, proximity to other recreation resources, existing conditions, environmental setbacks/restrictions and/or general propensity for a particular amenity.

The scale of improvements within these four plans vary greatly, from low-impact interventions on conservation land to diverse recreational offerings at a very complex site being treated for contamination. Each conceptual plan builds upon current site uses by proposing new resources that serve to activate the site. Precedent imagery provides a look into what future improvements and proposed activities might look or feel like and high-level budget allocation ground the conceptual plans, so it's clear what these future renovations and ideas would cost to construct.

Existing Site

A small woodland site, 32 Baker Avenue sits between Baker Avenue and the Assabet River in West Concord. The site is bounded to the north and south by commercial parcels including two banks, a restaurant, an office complex, railway line and two-story single-family and multi-family housing. The site is conservation land, and given its proximity to the Assabet River and a small seasonal stream along the north perimeter, various set-backs reduce the usable footprint of the site. 36A Baker Avenue has been newly acquired by the Town and is not signposted yet. The site was unknown by many participants in the community engagement process and is possibly under-utilized as a result. It is, however, brimming with recreational potential that could be included in an appropriate way.

Applying Overall Recommendations

The conceptual plan for 32A Baker Avenue addresses the following Town-wide recommendations identified in this plan:

- Town-wide Water Access Study Access (1A)
- Multi-modal Transportation Planning (1B)
- Consistency of Facility Signage & Site Furnishings (2A)
- More Diverse Play Opportunities (2E)
- Trailhead Nature Education/Maker Space (3C)

Online survey respondents repeatedly shared the desire to have better access to and along the waterways and ponds in Concord that have attracted people since its early inhabitants used it seasonally. The conceptual plan

at 32A Baker Avenue improves water access by:

- Enhancing the existing "out and back" trail so it is easier for single paddlers to carry their boats from the dedicated parking area to the canoe launch at the river's edge.
- Formalizing the canoe launch / public landing area with stones laid in the earth.
- Adding signage such as a canoe symbol at the parking lot entrance and a NRC wooden park sign at both the parking lot land entrance and the water access point, indicating the site as a place for paddlers to pause and enjoy a picnic.

Improved water access in Concord can be achieved through little gestures too. Creating moments for people to touch the water with their hands and toes. There may even be an opportunity to construct a small platform for discovery of this sensitive ecosystem. '

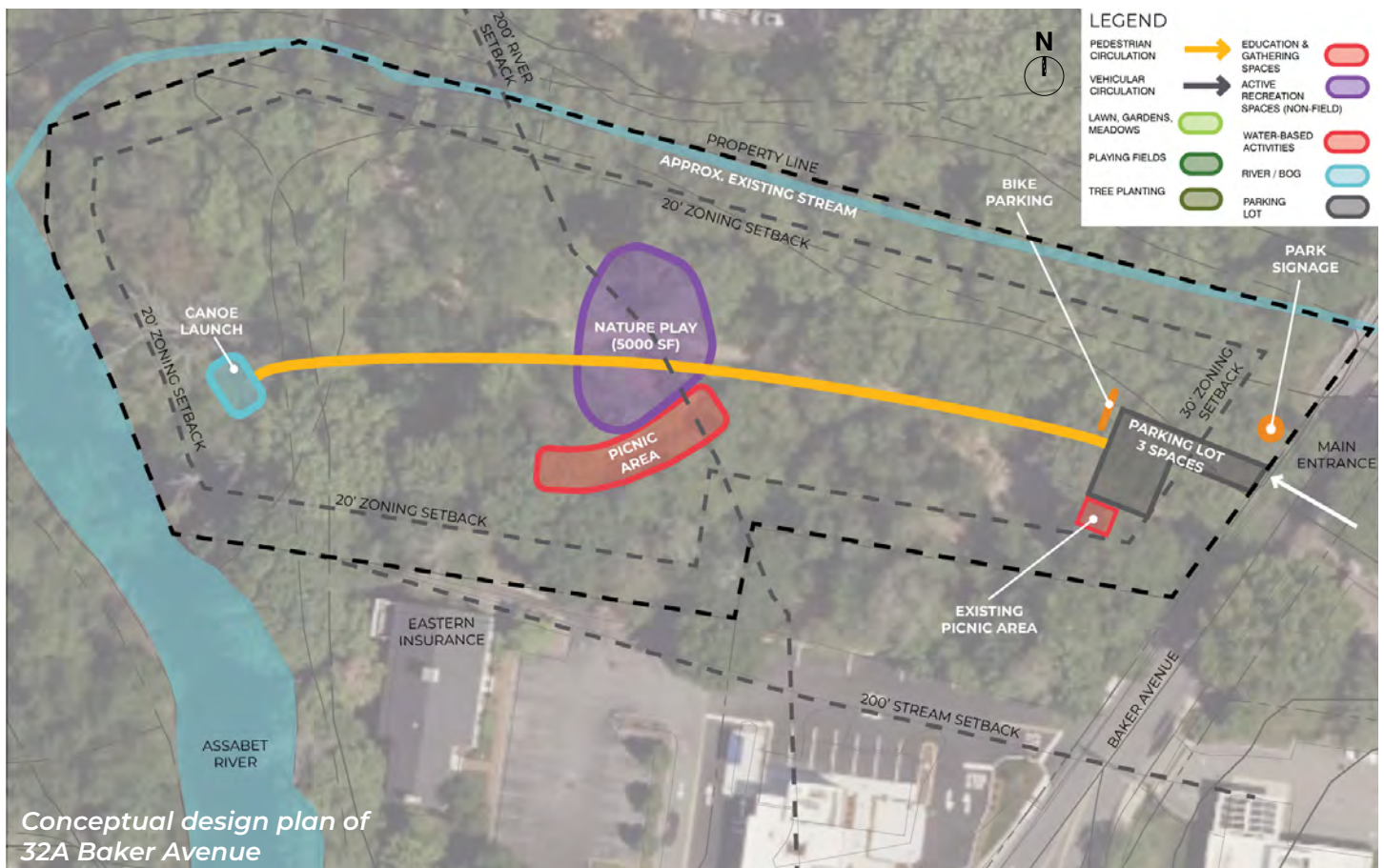
Play was repeatedly referenced throughout the planning process. People wanted more play spaces located throughout Town for kids of all ages from tots to teens. Comments about "unstructured," "creative," and "ambitious" play opportunities among multi-generation users were mentioned with survey respondents naming other central Massachusetts play spaces with

these qualities that they admired. The desire for more numerous and more exciting play spaces in Concord echoes the NRPA benchmarking findings: Concord is low when compared to communities with similarly sized population across the United States. See pages 48-49 for more details.

With this in mind, 32A Baker Avenue could include simple suggestive play materials that match its woodland setting. Found tree stumps for balancing or branches for making into temporary play huts could be added. Play could also engage multiple generations with a visitor-curated collection of nature items that could be integrated into the trailhead bulletin board, engaging both adults and children to share their nature discoveries with other visitors. This idea references the tree-house space at Discovery Center in nearby Acton.

Finally, the existing pollinator garden could be supplemented and enlarged to attract more insects and bird life to the native understory flowers and berry-covered shrubs. Pollinator gardens could be located near existing picnic groves and seating elements and continue to provide places for users to gather and rest. Ensuring these gathering spots are ADA accessible should also be prioritized when making improvements.

Leveraging the Site Assets

By increasing access to water, signposting, and offering a few additional elements, 32A Baker Avenue could attract more visitors who arrive by boat, car, bicycle or on foot. Adding natural and movable play elements to the site that can be manipulated over and over again by children creates a unique natural play space and encourages families to visit this mini neighborhood space again and again. These new amenities are light design interventions that thoughtfully fit the natural site and can be constructed relatively quickly, even in some cases on a temporary trial basis to test both user popularity and habitat impact.

Budget Considerations

Future ideas at 32A Baker Avenue could be pursued by the Town at relatively low cost. Salvaged or found materials could be used for the boat launch/public landing and fallen trees could be used as play elements. Labor might be provided at no cost by volunteer groups within the community such as the existing group that maintains trail for NRC or a local Boy/Girl Scout troop.

Existing Site Conditions

Cousins Field is a 10.5-acre Town-owned NRC site, comprised of two adjacent parcels within a residential neighborhood of West Concord. Permitted by Concord Recreation seasonally, the first parcel is a rectilinear multiuse field striped for soccer or lacrosse. The field is programmed at different times of year while at other times, it remains a flexible open space for leisure pursuits such as sunbathing, tossing a frisbee or dog-walking by local residents. The second parcel contains an extensive community garden with twenty-five (25) plots and a woodland and riparian buffer along the Assabet River. The buffer contains trails and informal river access.

The site is bounded by single-family housing, including some house who's back yards abut the site with no dividing fence, so it is difficult to understand where Town-owned lands end and private property begins. The Assabet River is located to the south of Cousins Field. Thoreau Elementary School is less than a five-minute walk due east. Cousins Field was observed to

largely serve the local neighborhood, although some community events such as the Concord Bike Rodeo have been held in the open field. There is no dedicated parking at Cousins Field, so users arriving in vehicles must park along neighborhood streets.

Applying Overall Recommendations

The conceptual plan for Cousins Field addresses the following Town-wide recommendations identified in this plan:

- Town-wide Water Access Study (1A)
- Rectangular Field Use Study (1C)
- Consistency of Facility Signage & Site Furnishings (2A)
- More Diverse Play Opportunities (2E)
- Outdoor Civic Gathering Spaces (3B)

Future ideas for Cousins Field seek to preserve the natural feel of the conservation land while enhancing some of its popular existing uses.

Accessible routes, like those newly installed at Emerson Park, were praised by many users within the online survey, especially seniors and those with mobility challenges. An accessible but permeable stone-dust perimeter walk-

It could connect the existing wood chip trails through the woodland and along the Assabet River. According to a NRPA report, parks with walking loops "have 80 percent more users, twice the number of senior users, and almost twice the level of moderate-to-vigorous physical activity as parks without loops." Providing a ADA accessible walking loop at Cousins Field might welcome new users by creating passive and potentially social ways to exercise.

The existing multiuse field at the center of Cousins Field will remain. Respondents to the online survey commented on the need for more and improved playing fields. If play warrants it through a sepa-

rate rectangular field use study, the multiuse field could be regraded and reseeded for improved sports play, particularly at Cousins Field which experiences poor drainage after a heavy rain.

Cousins Fields might offer other more informal ways for children to play, too. Whimsical unstructured play elements like wooden mushrooms sculpture or willow fairy huts could be located within the existing woodland. For children passing through the park on the way home from school, these unexpected play elements might offer a chance to engage in imaginative play and could be installed temporarily. Something more fixed, like a zip line might offer some mul-

tigenerational play fun for family members too.

Another reoccurring comment from the public during the planning process was the desire to gather in small and large groups outside which was a common request in a post-pandemic world. A simple gathering place with picnic tables and an all-weather shelter could be located near the community gardens, so that gardeners and other could talk, share harvests or swap seeds and planting techniques and more. Poles for BYOH (Bring Your Own Hammock!), simple wooden lounges for forest bathing, and/or additional seating might be positioned in different areas of the park to encourage relaxation among small groups of users.

Several online survey respondents shared their ideas about untapped opportunities at Cousins Field. Respondents wanted more opportunities for people to gather including more trees and benches placed along the open multiuse field and near the river for water views and observing wildlife. Some respondents suggested play equipment for children and improvements to the existing open field which is currently used for youth soccer. Such recreational improvements could diversify people's experiences, including sport, fitness, play, and relaxation for adults and children.

Leveraging the Site Assets

The current recreational offerings at Cousins Field already attract many local users. Popular resources such as the community gardens and the multiuse field could be enhanced with setting appropriate additions, such as a small gathering

space for gardeners or regrading and reseeding for improved sport performance. Simple natural play equipment could be tested temporarily at Cousins Field before any major capital investment is made for a larger play piece such as a zip line. These new interventions would sit lightly within the natural landscape of Cousins Field.

Budget Considerations

These recommendations for enhancing existing areas of Cousins Park could be pursued by the Town at moderate cost and within a moderate time frame depending on the scope of improvements. Any new improvements would require a design process with community input as well as a permitting period since Cousins Field is conservation land. Cousins Field should be included in the recommended rectangular field use study. This study would investigate whether there's a need in Concord for more and improved playing fields and if so, where they could be located. Trial play elements like the willow play huts could be developed in partnership with CCHS art students and local sculptors at The Umbrel-

Existing Site Conditions

The Concord-Carlisle Skate Park is approximately 7,500-square feet and is located near the historic center of Concord in the eastern side of the Concord-Carlisle High School (CCHS) campus. Woodland separates the Skate Park from neighboring single-family houses to the east. It is largely undeveloped except for the Skate Park and is maintained as a no mow open space in summer to encourage pollinators.

Based on the review of the available public records on the EEA Data Portal for Waste Site & Reportable Releases, there are three (3) RTN numbers for the high school campus and the RTN number specific to the Skate Park area is called the Concord-Carlisle High School Eastern Parking Lot: RTN 3-0030648. This is a closed RTN site with Activity and Use Limitation. A Licensed Site Professional (LSP) would need to submit regulatory documentation to the Massachusetts DEP for proposed work here.

Maintained by Concord Facilities, the parcel was historically a Town landfill. Capped today, any new amenities must be carefully evaluated to ensure that future uses neither disturb the site nor conflict with daytime school uses, including competing with the demand for parking by students. Currently, the recreation space offers six (6) wood/Skatelite elements and some seating.

Applying Overall Recommendations

The conceptual plan for the Concord-Carlisle Skate Park addresses the following overall recommendations identified in this plan:

- Rectangular Field Use Study (1C)
- Consistency of Facility Signage & Site Furnishings (2A)
- More Outdoor Courts of all Types (2D)
- More Diverse Play Opportunities (2E)
- Outdoor Civic Gathering Spaces (3B)
- New centralized Skating Rink (3D)

Community feedback focused on more diverse play opportunities and more outdoor civic gathering spaces especially for community performances and for Concord's middle school-aged children (tweens) and teenagers. The Skate Park site was chosen for conceptual planning given its central location on the high school campus where so many Concord-Carlisle teens spend their weekdays. Features that could be upgraded or added to the Skate Park facility include:

- Rehabilitated and/or improved skate park elements;
- A nine-hole disc golf course (frisbee) through the woodland buffer and flat open space to provide a challenging course for this growing sports trend among Massachusetts youth and young adults;
- A three-season pump track for mountain bikers and children on scooters;
- Three (3) full-size outdoor basketball courts;
- An outdoor Performing Arts Lawn with a covered stage to host musical concerts, festivals, Town celebrations and other community gatherings. The stage could double as a

teenage-hang out gathering space and the lawn could be graded and maintained as an additional multiuse sports field;

- Accessible walking loop for passive recreation and physical education classes.
- Cross-country ski facility across the whole site during winter; and,
- Winter ice skating rink might also be integrated into the performing arts lawn with further investigation.

Alternative sports have become increasingly popular in the United States and indeed, in Massachusetts. Alternative sports, sometimes called extreme or action sports, are known for higher levels of speed and risk. The idea at the Skate Park is to build upon the existing interest for alternative sports by providing more such opportunities to attract young adult, teen, and tween users. Ideas such as a BMX pump track, disc golf course and opportunities for additional winter sports were all comments frequently left by online survey respondents.

More outdoor courts for pickleball, tennis and basketball was a critical need identified through this planning process. The site's flat, undeveloped landscape make it ideal for three (3) full-sized basketball courts. The proximity to the high school make the courts convenient for after-school pick-up games and meet-ups.

Community feedback at the various public engagement events and via the online survey called for a professional outdoor space for concerts, performing arts con-

certs and events, Town celebrations, seasonal festivals, and community gatherings. Respondents mentioned already enjoying the summer concerts on offer in Concord parks but wanting more ways to connect with each other outdoors. A performing arts lawn is likely to be popular, so dedicated parking has been shown in the concept plan in addition to CCHS's parking lot. This additional parking could be permitted for day-time use by CCHS students during the school year. The proposed parking lot could be available for evening, weekend, and summer use by facility users, when CCHS is not in session.

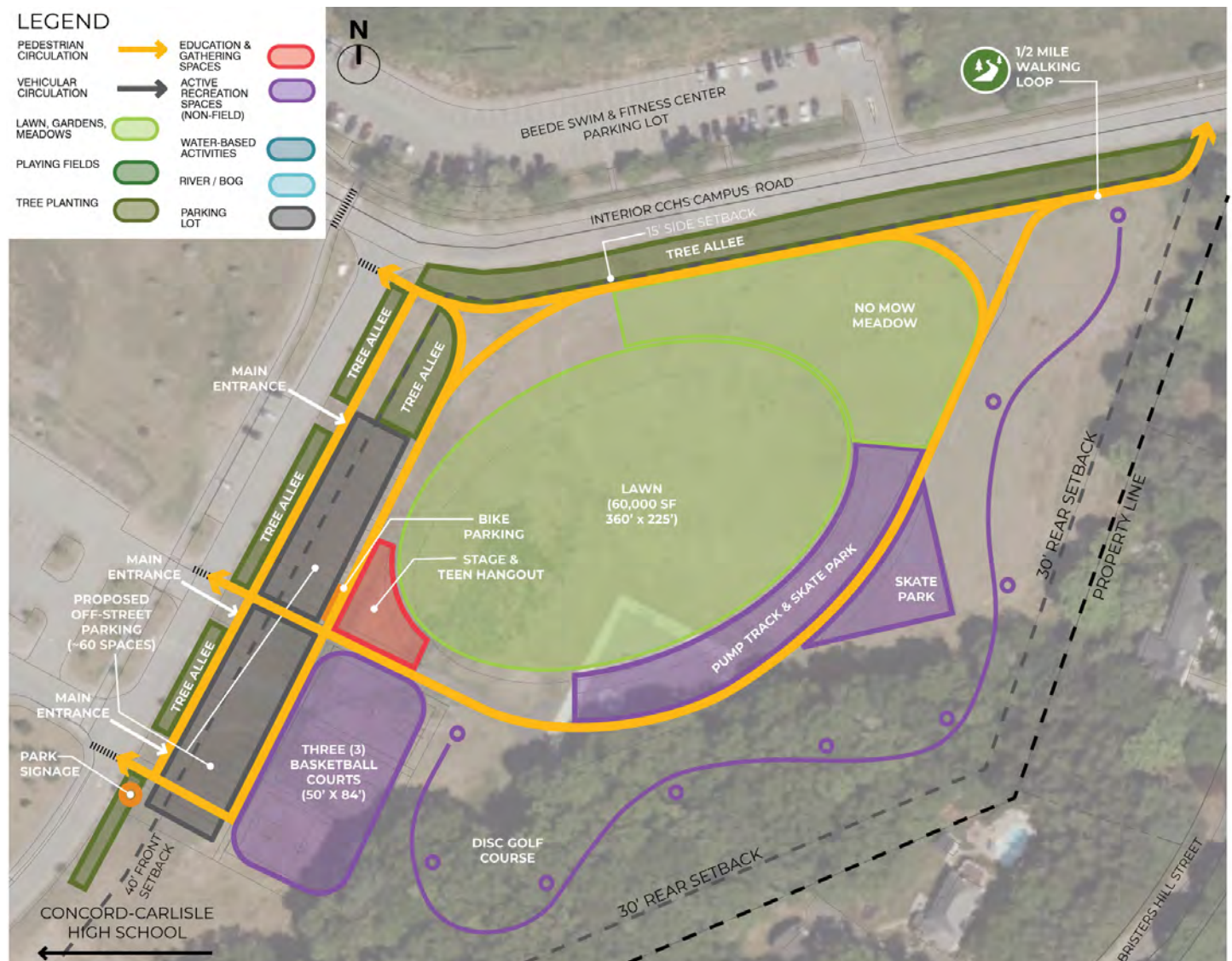
Leveraging the Site Assets

Examples of what's possible at Concord-Carlisle Skate Park leverage the site's existing history and proximity to both the high school and Town center as assets. The site's flat topography means ADA accessibility is easier to achieve. As

a former landfill, the site is capped, which prevents significant cut below grade but doesn't prohibit fill above grade to create a bike pump track. The facility's location on the CCHS campus offers a user group of young people who would have easy access to a fun place to play, exercise, gather and hang-out after school hours. The existing school parking lot can do double duty, remaining in use during events in the summer months and at weekends. Finally, the facility's proximity to Concord's historic center provides an additional venue to host events during wider Town celebrations.

Large portions of the Skate Park facility could continue to be maintained as a no mow meadowland, reducing the maintenance burden and helping to create edges between use zones across the site. Interpretative signage near these swathes of native pollinator meadow could educate the community and provide a learning opportunity for life sciences students on the importance

of insect life to our ecosystem and food production.

Allees, or lines of trees, could be planted along walking paths to improve the environmental health of the site. More trees provide shade, act as a wind break at this wind-swept site, and mitigate urban heat island effect on this exposed site. Trees could also lend more visual separation between this recreation and performance area and the school.

Budget Considerations

The Concord-Carlisle Skate Park parcel offers an exciting chance to explore alternative ways to play, recreate, gather outside together. The ideas aren't fanciful, instead they are grounded in recreation needs identified by the community through this planning process. Offering diverse recreational resources has the potential to attract and welcome new users, from within Concord and also across Metro West. A master plan for this facility is recommended to give overall vision to this space and ensure amenities are accommodated and/or phased appropriately.

Such interventions would require a substantial capital investment from the Town and potentially local, state or national donations and grants, not dissimilar to how the original Skate Park was developed. A Town champion, additional maintenance requirements, and an events team would be needed to ensure the professional quality and programming of such a performance space. Tree Sponsorship with tree dedications and Adopt-a-Tree programs could be created to help fund, establish and maintain the allees of trees.

Existing Site

2229 Main Street, also known as the Starmet Corporation site, is a 46.4-acre site in the southwest corner of the Town of Concord near the Town of Maynard. The site was previously used by Nuclear Metals, Inc., as a manufacturing site for uranium products. Part of this site contains contaminated soils and groundwater from hazardous waste that was discharged into an unlined holding basin. "Following immediate actions to protect human health and the environment, the site's long-term cleanup is ongoing," according to the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) website. Currently, the EPA has defined areas of interest and is expected to move from the pre-mitigation phase and begin the next phase of the clean-up process in spring 2023. Based on a review of the available public records on the Massachusetts EEA Data Portal for Waste Site and Reportable Releases, there are three (3) RTN numbers for the site: 3-0016846, 3-0000295, 3-0013756. Currently, 2229 Main Street is not owned by the Town of Concord, but the Town is in discussions for its purchase in the future.

The 2229 Main Street site is bounded by the Assabet River and a continuous woodland buffer and sphagnum bog. Immediately adjacent are two (2) commercial parcels and Main Street (62) roadway which runs from Bedford across the historic Town center of Concord, through West Concord. While any new interventions would need to be coordinated with remediation efforts, the parcel's large size, cleared land and extensive existing woodland present an incredible opportunity to develop the site for indoor and outdoor active and passive recreation.

A substantial opportunity for redevelopment, this large parcel could include many unmet recreation needs in Concord, providing more sport, play, and passive recreation options for a large, more diverse cross-section of the community in Concord. The illustrative plan on page 141 includes ideas for recreational amenities endorsed by many participants during this planning process.

A conceptual plan for 2229 Main Street has users entering the site via the existing entry along Main Street. Wrapped in a woodland buffer, the site is slowly revealed, taking full advantage of the existing grade for the large performing arts lawn and the new purpose-built indoor recreation center that greets pedestrians, cyclists and motorists as well as users arriving by public transportation travel to the new recreation complex via. The large front lawn could be used for community events yet also striped for an U-8 years multiuse field for soccer, lacrosse, and field hockey. The centerpiece of the new recreation complex is a 40,000-square foot indoor recreation center with indoor basketball courts, a raised track, community spaces for summer camp or evening classes, Town administration office space, and/or other desired uses. The size of this recreation center is based on an indoor recreation center study that was part of the RFSP; that study examined the size and uses of other area recreation centers local to Concord to suggest an appropriately sized recreation center that could accommodate the indoor recreation needs desired by the community. It can be found under Recommendation 3A.

The space around the indoor recreation center would be intensely programmed with many outdoor recreation amenities, all identified as recreational needs by the Concord community through this planning process. Outdoor amenities might include:

- Entry Plaza and Public Bus drop-off area with bicycle racks and attractive landscaping
- Splash Pad / Spray Deck
- Playground
- Bocce, shuffleboard, or similar lawn games courts
- ADA accessible sidewalks shaded by allee of trees

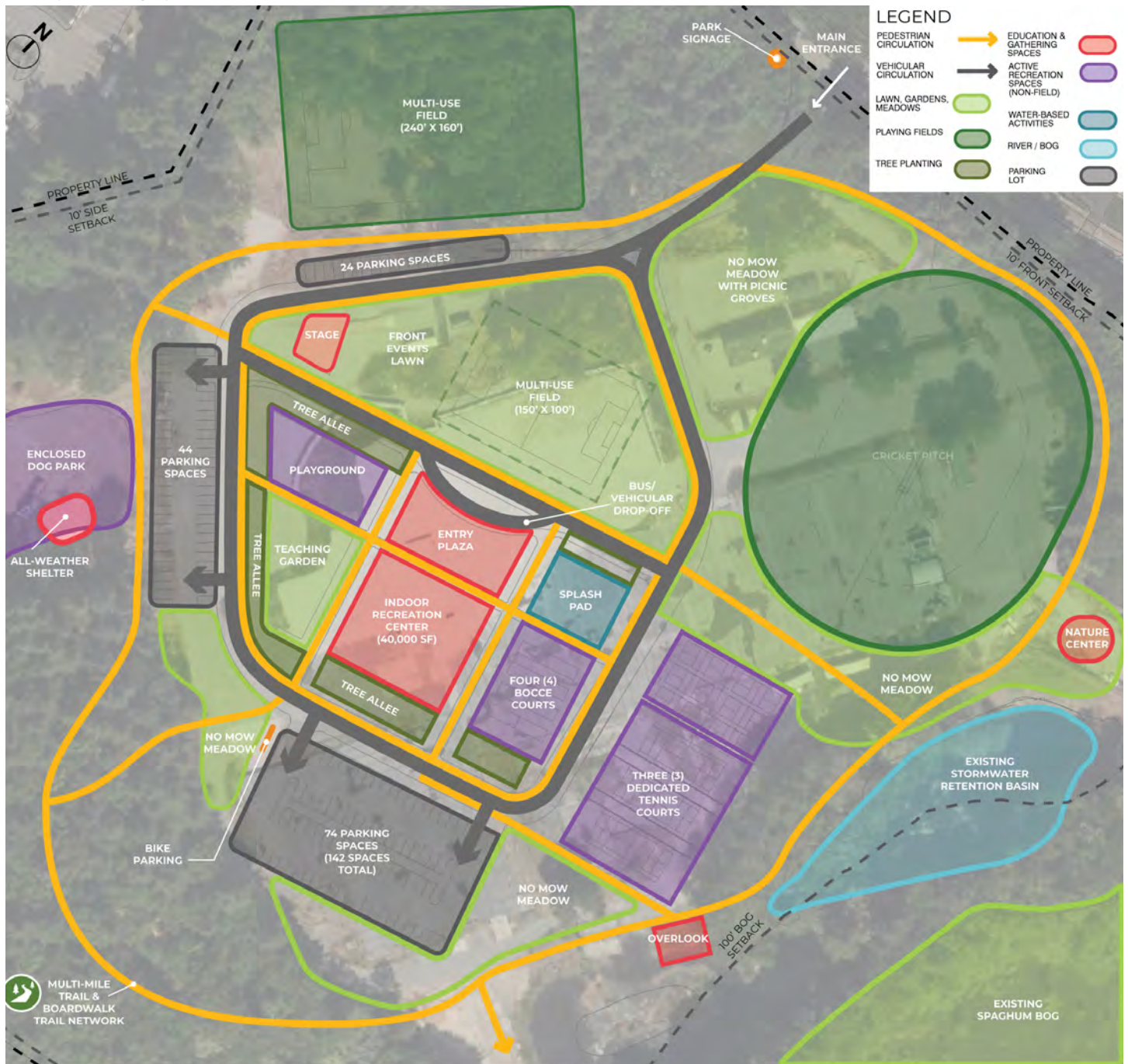

(1) An events lawn might also be sized to include a multiuse field; (2) Enclosed 'Bark Parks' foster fun for dogs and their owners; (3) Bright, large-scale play equipment offers something extraordinary and unexpected to children users; (4) Wooden pavilions allow flexible space for group exercise, nature-based education or maker spaces, or meeting place for researchers and volunteers; (5) Naturalistic spray deck/splash pad like the Beaver Brook Spray Deck in Belmont, MA was repeatedly referenced by survey respondents; (6) Interpretive signage could be located along a trail system. Given the amount of amenities, a significant amount of vehicle and bike parking would be needed. Three (3) parking lots could be both behind the Indoor Recreation Center as well as along a ring road that surrounds this center core of activity. This would provide an active frontage as users approach the front events lawn and central indoor recreation center but also place parking in close proximity to fields, courts and other amenities.

Deeper into the site are fields, courts, and opportunities for passive recreation such as hiking and wildlife observation. These include:

- Full-size multiuse fields (240' x 160')
- Full-size cricket field, due to growing sports trend in central Massachusetts
- Six (6) dedicated pickleball courts
- Three (3) dedicated tennis courts
- No-mow lawn areas, including some with sheltered picnic groves
- Self-use Nature Center and Overlook connected to Sphagnum Bog Trail

The Concord Recreation department and NR-PA-Massachusetts were consulted on recent sports trends in Metro-West and New England. The increased demand for space to play cricket was included in the conceptual plan for 2229 Main Street to address this recently identified sports need. Similarly, the rising popularity of pickleball in Concord led to the inclusion of dedicated outdoor courts for this sport, tennis and basketball at this site. All of which were specifically requested by people throughout the RFSP community engagement process.

Nature centers and ways to engage with the abundance of natural spaces in Concord were also specifically mentioned by respondents at community engagement events and in the online survey. Such a space might include information on self-guided activities such as educational walking tours, geo-caching, and wildlife photography as well as physical outdoor meeting room for Scout groups, classes, researchers, and volunteers. Located near the extensive sphagnum bog present on this site, a nature center provides a great opportunity to educate residents and visitors on the environmental value of this type of landscape.

Leveraging the Site Assets

The relatively large size of the vacant parcel and its location along a major thoroughfare with high visibility allows for great redevelopment

uses and the potential for additional investment in this area of Concord. The proximity to residential properties and the convenience of so many recreation options in one location make this conceptual plan particularly attractive to families and a more diverse user group. Facilities, like the proposed cricket field and fenced dog park, might attract organizations who have not had the facilities needed to sport their recreation needs. The woodland surrounding the site creates a buffer to absorb sounds generated from so many sports activities and this forested area along with the sphagnum bog provide hiking, nature education, wildlife viewing and other passive recreation opportunities as well.

Budget Considerations

Once the clean-up effort is complete, pursuing these ideas at 2229 Main Street brings public use to a formerly private and contaminated site. Developing the site involves long-term clean-up and monitoring, a long-term permitting process, and significant capital investment for the Town of Concord. Critically, redesign of the site would need to be carefully coordinated with cleanup efforts. Design alone would likely take several years and a master plan would likely need a phasing strategy with the site likely broken up into several phases due to the cost. Despite these constraints, a comprehensive sports complex offering diverse and extensive indoor and outdoor recreation resources should be considered by the Town of Concord to help address some of the community's recreation needs.
